

## Vaccine Definitions:

### K-9:

DHPP – Distemper, Hepatitis, Parvovirus, Para Influenza

- Canine Distemper is a widespread, often fatal disease.
- Hepatitis is a respiratory infection which causes severe kidney damage or fatality and is an important factor in “kennel Cough.”
- Parvovirus is a disease of widespread distribution which may cause severe dehydrating diarrhea in dogs of varying ages.
- Para Influenza is a mild respiratory infection, severe/fatal in puppies and debilitated dogs and also a factor in “Kennel Cough.”

Corona – Coronavirus

- A highly contagious intestinal disease that causes vomiting and diarrhea in dogs of all ages, especially puppies, and can be fatal.

Bordetella – Bronchiseptica

- An airborne bacterial infection which contributes to “Kennel Cough.”

### Feline:

FVRCP – Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Feline Calicivirus, Feline Panleukopenia (Feline Distemper)

- FVR is a highly contagious respiratory disease that causes sneezing, loss of appetite, fever, eye inflammation and discharge from nose/eyes.
- Feline Calicivirus is a serious feline respiratory infection, often occurs simultaneously with FRV. Signs of infection are similar to FVR but may also include ulcers on the tongue.
- Feline Distemper is among the most widespread of all cat diseases. It is extremely contagious and can cause fever, loss of appetite, vomiting and diarrhea, and can be fatal.

FELV – Feline Leukemia

- A viral disease which takes several forms. Some cats have transient infections varying in severity and may be fatal over time.

### K-9 & Feline:

Rabies – Rabies Virus

- It attacks the brain and central nervous system. Aggressive behavior and foaming at the mouth are the first signs of the virus. Almost always fatal.
